Parry's *Songs of Farewell* are a cycle of six unaccompanied motets composed in the final year of his life. They are as much a personal leave-taking as they are a poignant tribute to so many of his pupils who made the ultimate sacrifice on the Western Front. The first five songs set very powerful English poetry of the 16th to 19th centuries and the final song sets verses 5–15 of Psalm 39. The textures expand from four parts, through five, six and seven, culminating in eight-part double choir. They are, without doubt, the finest choral music written by an Englishman since the time of Byrd, Tallis and Purcell.

Dvorák's *Mass in D* was commissioned by Josef Hlávka, the wealthy architect, patron, and founder of the Czech Academy, for the consecration of the new chapel beside his castle in Luzany. Written in 1887 for chorus, soloists (all four of whom are drawn from the choir) and organ, it is a work of great beauty and poise with flowing, lyrical melodies and characterful rhythmic cross-currents.

Roger Briscoe will accompany with his usual musical sensitivity on the magnificent Viscount Organ.

Do please, come and join us for an evening of contemplative, tuneful and beautiful music.
