#### INTRODUCING SIMON MERCER

Originally from West Sussex, Simon was a chorister from the age of 7 and began playing the organ aged 12. His teenage musical love was the trumpet, which he studied with Crispian Steele-Perkins, taking part in performances of the Bach *Magnificat* and *B Minor Mass* and becoming Principal Trumpet in the Brighton Youth Orchestra at 14.

He became Assistant Organist at Arundel R.C. Cathedral as a sixth-former and began formal organ lessons with Alan Thurlow at Chichester Cathedral.

Simon read Music at the University of Sheffield, studying at the cathedral with Graham Matthews, who even now acts as guide and mentor.



Simon's passion for directing began here and he conducted all of the University ensembles and choirs. Postgraduate work at the RNCM and in Sheffield followed, before he was appointed Assistant Organist at St George's Church, Stockport, and Assistant Director of Music at Cheadle Hulme School.

Further teaching posts followed at St Ambrose College and Marple 6th Form College, before his final appointment as Director of Music at The King's School in Macclesfield. Whilst he found school work highly fulfilling, Simon also conducted KEMS, Marple Choral Society and Prestbury Choral Societies.

He joined the staff at JRNCM in 1991 on the academic side and has been teaching the organ there for over 20 years; many of his pupils have gone on to scholarships at Oxford and Cambridge Universities as well as to conservatories and cathedrals. Simon also teaches for the Royal College of Organists and has been an ABRSM examiner since 2002.

Simon left the teaching profession after 25 years in July 2014. He is now pursuing a varied freelance career as performer, conductor, tutor and mentor. He and Matt Palmer (trumpet) formed their duo partnership in 2005

on a lively tour of Upper Austria and Vienna and most recently performed in Buxton. They will be playing in Manchester in the New Year.

Simon guest-conducted the RNCM Symphony Chorus in their preparations for Mahler 2 and the British Premier of Pendereki's 7th Symphony; he was the founding Director of the Hallé Choral Academy and has been Director of the JRNCM Vocal Ensemble for 5 years. This elite choir of 65 highly talented young musicians performs diverse repertoire by Bach, Chilcott, Duruflé, Fauré, Lauridsen, Whittaker and many more.

He is really looking forward to working with Hayfield Singers having taken over in October.

#### THE CHOIR

In October 1992 Tricia Howitt founded the Hayfield Singers with the support of Jonathan Holland, who became the choir's first conductor. The choir's inaugural concert was in December of that year at St Matthew's Church, Hayfield, thus beginning a long and fruitful relationship with both the church and the village. The choir has grown steadily since its inception, now numbering around sixty singers drawn from Hayfield, New Mills, Glossop, Whaley Bridge and the surrounding area.

Following Tricia's untimely death in October 2015, Jonathan returned to lead the choir for the following season. When he moved away from the local area, the Singers, for the first time, were required to recruit a professional musical director. New Zealander Lindy Tennent-Brown took up the baton for a year until she too moved away, and was succeeded in turn by our current director, Simon Mercer.

In this our 25th year we welcome you to St Matthew's and we hope you enjoy our first concert under Simon's leadership.

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

#### THE SOLOISTS

Ceferina Penny (soprano) is 17 years old and in her third year at the Junior Royal Northern College of Music (JRNCM), where she is the vocalist for the



New Music Ensemble. Recently she was awarded a High Distinction in her ABRSM Grade 8 Singing exam. She has performed since 2011 (both at home, abroad and on recordings as a soloist) with the National Children's Choir of Great Britain, most notably during a 2016 tour of northern Spain, the highlight being a solo performed in the fabulous Burgos Cathedral. At the JRNCM, where she recently received the Helen Latto 'Soroptimists' prize for singing, Ceferina studies voice with Jenny Heslop, who formerly taught her at Manchester High School for Girls, where she is a Year 13 pupil. Enjoying all things musical, when not

singing, she can regularly be found in the percussion section of the school orchestra. Ceferina has won numerous festival awards, recently winning five vocal solo classes at the 2017 Alderley Edge Festival. She was also presented with the Music Award for Best Overall Singer and as a result was nominated to take part in the North West Regional Championship, held in September, where she won the the voice section. In 2015 Ceferina was selected to take part in a masterclass at the prestigious Oxenfoord International Summer School. Ceferina maintains a passion for singing with her local church, St James and Emmanuel, Didsbury, where she particularly enjoys singing with the much acclaimed Church Consort.

Mia Serracino-Inglott (alto) is a Year 13 student at Manchester High School for Girls where she is studying for A-levels in Music, Drama, Spanish and



English Literature. Outside school she leads a busy and varied musical and dramatic life. She has been studying at JRNCM for the last five years where her singing teacher is Jenny Heslop. She is a valued member of the JRNCM Vocal Ensemble but also performs in many other genres. Mia joined the Hallé Children's Choir in 2010 and soon progressed to the Youth Choir; she regularly performs at the

Bridgewater Hall conducted by Sir Mark Elder and will be singing at the Proms again this summer. She is a member of the National Youth Music Theatre company. Mia has taken part in vocal masterclasses given by

internationally recognised musicians Malcolm Martineau and Gary Matthewman and has performed as a soloist for the Philharmonic Choir of Manchester in the Vivaldi *Gloria*.

Glyn Webster (tenor) is 16 years old. He attends the JRNCM and the Manchester Grammar School, where he is studying for his A-levels. Glyn's

strongest musical interest is in singing, and from the age of six he has sung in choirs such as the Kinder Choir, Halle Youth Choir, the National Youth Boys' Choir and he has attended several of the Junior Eton Choral Courses. As a soloist, Glyn enjoyed a significant treble career, singing in two productions at Opera North including a principal role in Handel's Joshua. He has sung with orchestras such as Welsh National Opera, Britten Sinfonia, and Orchestra of Opera North, taking the leading vocal part with these orchestras in Christmas productions of *The* 



Snowman. At the Buxton Festival, Glyn co-starred as James in James and the Giant Peach in 2012. Now a tenor, he is involved in several close-harmony groups including a barbershop quartet and he directs his own ensemble at JRNCM. Glyn hopes to study music at university, and in addition to singing he is active in choral conducting and he also enjoys playing the violin, piano and organ.

Henry Reavey (bass) is from Macclesfield and reads music in his second year at the University of Birmingham. Piano is his first study at Birmingham

but he continues singing lessons in Manchester with Richard Strivens. Henry has enjoyed singing in choirs since joining the King's School in Macclesfield in reception. Since his voice settled as a bass/baritone he started singing lessons with Richard at King's and sang solos in Fauré's Requiem and Haydn's Maria Theresa Mass. After a year of singing lessons Henry began attending the JRNCM where he took singing as his first study for three years with Richard and sang in the Vocal Ensemble under Simon Mercer and Eduardo Portal, including solos in Mozart's



Coronation Mass and Duruflé's Requiem. At JRNCM his desire to learn about music both practically and theatrically grew more and confirmed that he wanted to study music at university. Outside of music Henry's biggest interest is football and he is a big Manchester United fan.

#### THE MUSIC

#### J S Bach: Magnificat BWV 243a (texts p. 11)

As it was written in 1723 for the first Sunday of Advent, it is appropriate to perform this masterpiece this evening in the 500th anniversary year of the Reformation. Originally in the key of E flat, Bach brought it down into bright D major and makes great use of the trumpets and timpani.

The sheer joy and rapture expressed by the Virgin Mary permeates the entire five-part choral texture and Bach's word-painting is nothing short of genius. The rhythmic repetitions of the word "Magnificat" and the jocular way in which the chorus abruptly bustles in at the end of the second soprano aria with *Omnes generationes* ("all generations") are just two of numerous excellent examples of his art.

The "Four Christmas Interpolations" are rarely performed but are here, as in 1723, woven between movements recalling the words and music of Luther and medieval plainsong.

These forty minutes of music are a distillation of the best in Bach's output and can be savoured in the same way as a fine malt whisky or a cognac.

#### Morten Lauridsen: O Magnum Mysterium (text p. 12)

"For centuries, composers have been inspired by the beautiful text depicting the birth of the new-born King amongst the lowly animals and shepherds. This affirmation of God's grace to the meek and the adoration of the Blessed Virgin are celebrated through a quiet song of profound inner joy." (Lauridsen). First performed in December 1994, this is justifiably one of his most famous and best-loved works. Born in 1943 and beginning his career as a forest firefighter, Lauridsen studied at the University of Southern California, joining the staff in 1967, and has remained there ever since. A multi-award winner at national and international level, he is one of the most recorded and performed of all choral composers.

#### Chris Williams: In the Bleak Midwinter and Welcome Yule!

Chris Williams is a friend and collaborator of Graham Wili, who has sung with the Hayfield Singers as a soloist in the past. We are performing two works from Williams' *Nowell! Nowell!*, a collection of carols and rounds for choirs. This set of books has been donated to the Hayfield Singers in memory of Dr Andrew Fisher, an enthusiastic and much-missed member of our tenor section, who particularly loved this new version of *In the Bleak Midwinter*.

#### Herbert Howells: Here is the little door

This is the first of the Three Carol Anthems written in 1915 and 1916 whilst the composer was recovering from Graves' Disease and working with R.R. Terry at Westminster Cathedral. They edited a vast corpus of Latin Tudor repertoire which influenced all of Howells' subsequent choral works. This lovely carol sets a poem by Francis Chesterton describing the arrival of the Magi and their feelings at the presentation of the gifts. Exquisite in its pathos and depth, it is a real gem.

He hath put down the mighty from their seat: and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things: and the rich he hath sent empty away.
